



What is Japan?

Population: 127 million



Mountainous Terrain: 75%



Number of Islands: 5



Vibrant Capital: Tōkyō



What is “Tōkaidō”?

- An old road between Kyōto and Tōkyō
- About 300 miles long
(Seattle – Spokane 280 miles)
- From country road to Bullet Train route






E-Maki Narrative Picture Scrolls



Edo Era


1603 - 1868

Major Roads Re-established

- No major civil wars for 265 years
- From 1603, the shōgun family, Tokugawa, ruled Japan until returning power to the Emperor in 1868 (restoring Imperial rule).


