Teacher Preparation Before School Visit

Classroom teachers have been asked to prepare students in advance.

- ◆ Classroom desks and chairs grouped into four "restaurants" to accommodate class size. Remaining desks and chairs are moved to classroom perimeter. クラス人数に合わせて机と 椅子を4つの島(レストラン)に組み合わせて下さい。残りの机と椅子を教室の周囲に避けて下さい。
- ◆ Teacher distributes phrase sheets received from JIS coordinator レストランの表現シートを 先生が生徒に配布して下さい。

Preparation Before Class

- ◆ Ask teacher to set up PPT "Restaurant" PPT の 設定を先生にお願いして下さい。
- Set out contents for each "restaurant":

DESKS: tablecloths & menus **AT FRONT:** dishes, cutlery box

EACH VOLUNTEER: apron, memo pad, pencil

- A. Volunteer/Leader Introductions プレゼンリーダー、ボランティアの自己紹介
- B. Visit Components:

Ordering Food - 食べ物を注文する Commenting on Food - 食べ物について話す Paying the Bill - お勘定の支払い

- C. Students sit at one of the "restaurants". Encourage them to form groups of equal numbers.

- D. Leader indicates first restaurant プレゼンリーダーが最初のレストランをクラスに伝えて下さい。

II. Roll Plays - 30 minutes ロールプレー 30分

- B. After each meal, presentation leader announces new restaurant
- C. Group starts ordering from new menu
- D. OPTION: student may take role of waitperson if they want to try

III. Conclusion - 3 minutes まとめ 3分

- B. What did you learn today?
- C. Any other comments or questions?

Restaurant Presentation & Script







1. Restaurant - Today's Lesson

Leader and volunteers introduce themselves.

例: 「お早うございます(こんにちは)。 JISの全員は日本語で自己紹介する。 私の名前は、○○です。宜しくお願いします。」

Leader: How many of you have been to Japan?

What did you eat?

Today we will learn how to order food, talk about the food, and pay the bill in a restaurant.

2. 日本食

Leader: Do you recognize these foods?

Volunteer: Click next food and wait for the students to identify. **ボランティア**: 生徒の反応を見ながら次から次へと食べ物をクリックして下さい。

Leader: There are many different places you can eat in Japan.



3. Eating in Japan - Department Stores & Malls

Leader: In Japan there are many restaurants in department stores and malls.

Click 1: Big departments stores have a floor just for restaurants. Click 2: At the restaurant entrance, you will see a menu with real-

looking food. But it's not real, it's fake!

Click 3: There are also food courts, just like in America.

4. Eating in Japan - Restaurants

Leader: You can also eat at regular restaurants.

Do you see the photo at the bottom?

It has both Japanese-style and Western-style seating. If you want to eat in the Japanese-style tables, make sure to

take off your shoes before stepping onto the tatami.







5. Today's Restaurants

Leader: Today we will eat at three different restaurants:

Click 1: a rāmen place, Click 2: a pizza place, Click 3: and a tea house.

Leader: Our first restaurant will be a ramen shop.

(Pointing to the expressions on the left) In a rāmen shop, you are usually asked 4 questions:

1. Rāmen flavor: soy, miso, salt or pork

Noodle texture: firm, regular or soft
 Broth richness: strong, regular or mild

4. Toppings: for example nori, flavored egg, green onion, etc.

Let's practice these expressions.

Click 1: Here is the menu.

Click 2: Let's practice this conversation. I will point to the menu choices.

7. ピザ屋 Pizza

Leader: Dominoes is a popular pizza chain in Japan.

(Pointing to the left) Here are your pizza menu options.

1. Order your pizza

2. Choose your crust type

3. Choose your size

Click 1: This is the pizza menu.

Click 2: Let's practice this conversation. I will point to the menu choices.

8. お茶屋 Tea House

Leader: Our last restaurant is a traditional Japanese tea house.

(Pointing to the left) These are your choices for ordering tea

and dango.

1. Order your tea

2. Order dango

Click 1: This is the tea menu.

Click 2: Let's practice this conversation. I will point to the menu choices.

9. Q: どうですか?

Leader: Do you know the opposite of these words? Let's try!

Volunteer: Wait for students to answer before clicking new antonym.

Leader: So, let's practice the conversation.

Leader chooses name and food to insert in spaces.

10. お勘定 - おかんじょう - Paying the Bill

Leader: One person in each group will decide to treat everyone at the

table. Everyone else will say, "Thank you!".
The person who's treating will ask the server for the tab.
Please remember to use the tray when handling money.

Leader: Now let's practice the conversation.

Divide class in half. One half reads「せいと1」 the other half reads 「せいと2」 and the leader (volunteer) reads「店員」.
